Dear Parishioners of St. Paul,

Unfortunately, we have bad news today. Our main air conditioning system for the church, hall, kitchen, and Sunday School rooms has finally died. Our current chiller system is 45 years old and was installed when the hall was first built. To give you a better idea, the average life of a chiller system of this size is probably around 35 years. We have been having problems with the chiller for many years and knew it was only a matter of time before this day would come.

This chiller system is very different from your home air conditioner. Most large buildings (like schools) use a large chiller system. The chiller cools water to around 42 degrees and sends it out to the church, halls, kitchen, and Sunday school rooms where the warm/hot air is passed through the cold water, cooled, and sent back to the building. The compressor for the chiller system looks like a large truck engine.

Here are a few pictures...





We have a few choices for repairs. We could purchase a re-built compressor which would cost us around \$64,000. The problem with a re-built is it would probably only last, at best, 10 years, and we would probably still experience problems with the older parts not being replaced. This model of chiller is no longer manufactured so parts are hard to find when it does break down. Our last option is to replace the 45-year-old system with a new system at a cost somewhere between \$250,000 and \$350,000. This is by far the most expensive piece of equipment we have on our church property.

This replacement will take some time. To design and plan for a new chiller will take a few months. The installation will take roughly another month, so you can see there is no immediate fix. The complications with the COVID-19 virus has made obtaining parts and equipment more difficult.

This project will be a huge undertaking and will require not only months of planning but also obtaining the necessary permissions from the parish.

Since the original construction of our church, we have never been called upon to raise this kind of money. Of course, we could go without air conditioning, but aren't sure how many people would want to attend church in 100 degrees. This is going to be a huge challenge. How will the St. Paul parish rise to the occasion? In the heat of summer, Der Hayr, your deacons, and choir members will be in church conducting services, most probably still live streaming, and at the same time praying for those that will come forward as heroes for St. Paul to be moved to donate. We will keep you updated on this project in the weeks to come.

Due to the fact that the two largest yearly fundraisers for the church, (the Annual Armenian Festival and the Grape Blessing Picnic), were cancelled this year, the drive-thru lunches have become a vital source of revenue for the church. 
