Growing up, Queenie Emerzian was always close to her family. Her father, Mihran, was born in Samsun, Turkey in 1908. At the age of 10, he and his 12-year old brother, Jivan, were orphaned during the early years of the genocide. Together, the two young boys were forced to live in an orphanage in Constantinople. When news of the boys' survival reached their Uncle Harry Karagozian in the United States, plans were quickly made to adopt the boys and move them to California. Mihran, at 11, and Jivan, 13, landed by boat at Ellis Island in the New York Harbor, along with other Armenian immigrants coming from Samsun, all praying for a new life in a new land.

Once the young boys reached New York, the next part of their journey was made by train. Speaking only Armenian and Turkish, they managed to completely cross the United States to California, and finally to Fresno to meet their family. Once they arrived, as instructed by their Armenian neighbors from Samsun, the boys looked closely for the gold paved streets and hidden treasure under the fig trees.

The young brothers started school and Mihran learned English very quickly. They also worked in the fields for their Uncle Harry, learning about farming, figs, and raisins. Mihran enjoyed high school at Sanger High, where he loved playing football for his school.

At the age of 22, Mihran met a beautiful young lady named Mae Alexander. They fell in love and were married in 1930. Queenie was born in 1932 and blessed with the name of Mihran's mother. Her sister Betty was born two years later, in 1934.

As Queenie grew up, attending church at St. Paul was an important part of family life. Several of her cousins were in the choir, which she excitedly joined with her sister when she was 10 years old. Queenie's mom, Mae, tragically passed away from a prolonged illness when Queenie was just a young girl. The death of her mom created an extremely close bond with her sister and her father Mihran.

Queenie wanted greatly to continue her education after she graduated from Roosevelt High School in 1951. She worked hard at babysitting to save enough money to pay the fees to attend Fresno City College. At the age of 22, Queenie met a handsome young man named John Emerzian at an Armenian dance on Blackstone Avenue. They married in 1956, and their marriage was blessed with 3 sons. John H. was born in 1957, Michael followed in 1959, and their family was complete with the arrival of Thomas Paul in 1961.

While Queenie was busy raising her three sons, she also worked part-time for Fresno Unified. She and her husband were also very involved in church life, working with different church organizations, volunteering, and mentoring as her boys grew. She loved hosting Senior ACYO events and became famous for her delicious desserts and cheese boreg.

In 1967, Queenie was asked to take a full-time position as a Career Counselor for Roosevelt High School, her alma mater. It was a position she had not held previously but she was always up for a challenge. She took the job and managed it beautifully for the next 29 years when she retired. Never one to back down from trying something new, in 1992, after the death of her father Mihran, she took over the running of her father's ranch. Queenie loved overseeing the 40 acres of grapes and implementing new innovations such as mechanical picking machines. She retired from her work on the ranch after 16 years.

Queenie has been a member of our church for 80 years. She has been a member of the Ladies Society for 51 years, serving on the Executive Board as well as assisting with a myriad of lunches, dinners, and fundraising events. Queenie believes that the Ladies Society was an anchor for her in her young life as she raised her children. It can be said that Queenie has been an anchor for St. Paul Church and our parish.
