While finishing college, she made a fateful trip to Fresno to visit her cousin for the Memorial Day holiday. The ladies decided to enjoy an evening out and go dancing at the Rainbow Ballroom. While dancing, Shenora met a very handsome young man named George Adishian. George, a Fresno native, recognized the sweet spirit of

Shenora and her kind heart. Once she went home to Tacoma, they stayed in touch by writing letters. The two fell in love and chose the month of February, in 1954, to be married in the new St. Paul Armenian Church at Merced and N Streets.

Shenora and George began their lives together in Fresno, and she accepted a position teaching at Carver School on the westside in 1954. After two years of teaching, George and Shenora welcomed the blessing of their first child, Mardelle. Arthur and Deborah followed, and she devoted her days to raising her three children. Once her children were older, Shenora turned back to teaching. She taught 2nd grade at Alice Burney School, kindergarten at Armenian Community School for 10 years, and also did substitute teaching for the Fresno Unified School District. She fondly credits the time she taught at the Armenian School with increasing her knowledge and love for speaking Armenian.



Throughout the years, Shenora has been part of many activities in and outside of our church. She has taught Sunday School as well as Christian Education at Charlie Keyan Armenian School. She continues to be a member of the Ladies Society and is always willing to share an uplifting devotion or prayer. She has been part of the Evangel Home committee for many years, sharing her time and her faith with the ladies of the home. Shenora loves reading the Bible, and learning all she can about the God we serve. She attended Bible Study Fellowship for ten years, which she greatly enjoyed.

Shenora loves to share scripture, and talk about the wonders of God. If you have had the sweet opportunity to visit with her, everyone you will agree that she does exemplify the fruits of the spirit. Shenora is loving, joyful, peaceful, patient, kind, good and faithful.




